KEYNOTE SPEAKER DEMARCO MORGAN

Morgan is an American news reporter, anchor and journalist. He holds a Bachelor of Science from Jackson State University, Mississippi and a Master's from Columbia University Graduate School of Journalism. While working on his Master's, he covered the September 11 terrorist attacks, helped found the J-School's student chapter of the National Association of Black Journalists (NABJ) and was named both a DuPont Scholar and a CBS Scholar. In 2002, Morgan was the only Black male ranked in the Scripps Howard's Top 10 Collegiate Journalists in the country.

Morgan is also a native of Tulsa, Oklahoma, the site of one of the nation's worst incidents of racial violence known as the Tulsa Race Massacre. The massacre occurred in 1921 when a white mob killed dozens of Black residents and destroyed more than 35 square blocks of Black homes and businesses. Morgan will provide a distinct perspective on the continued struggle for justice a century after the Tulsa massacre.


Mason Mack is a senior at



REGINALD SMITH, JR.

Baritone Reginald Smith, Jr. has been lauded as a "passionate performer" (The New York Times) with an "electric, hall-filling" (The Baltimore Sun) and "thrillingly dramatic" (Opera News) voice that is "one of the most exciting baritone sounds to come along in years" (Opera News).

Mr. Smith, a native of Atlanta, Georgia, was a Grand Finals winner of the 2015 Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions and a graduate of the Houston Grand Opera Studio. He has appeared in operatic performances with Opera Theatre of St. Louis, Wolf Trap Opera, Toledo Opera and Houston Grand Opera. In concert, Mr. Smith has performed with the Indianapolis Chamber Orchestra, Cincinnati Pops, Lexington Philharmonic, Columbus Symphony Orchestra (GA), North Carolina Symphony, Johnson City Symphony, Boise Philharmonic, Atlanta Symphony Orchestra, Houston Symphony Orchestra and the Tchaikovsky Symphony Orchestra at Tchaikovsky Hall in Moscow, Russia.

Previous operatic highlights include *La Bohème* (Marcello), *Die Fledermaus* (Falke), *Madam Butterfly* (Sharpless), *La Traviata* (Giorgio Germont), *The Pirates of Penzance* (The Pirate King), *Gounod's Romeo and Juliet* (Capulet) and *The Marriage of Figaro* (Count Almaviva). Mr. Smith will appear as Dr. Bartolo in Cincinnati Opera's 2021 season production of *The Barber of Seville*.
