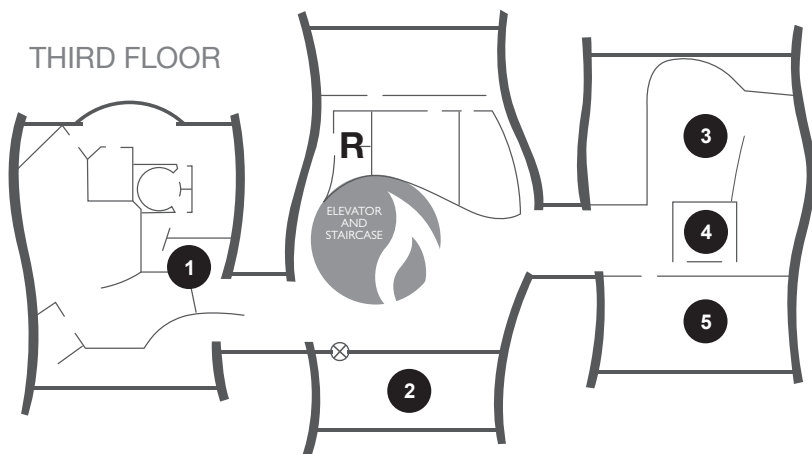
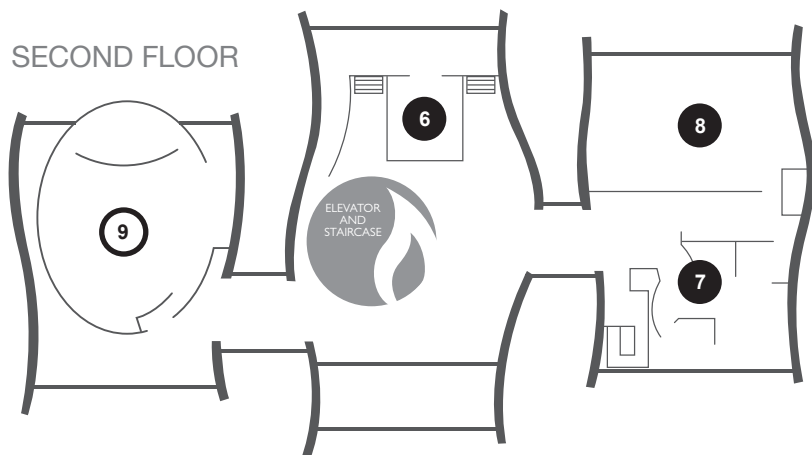


Building Map

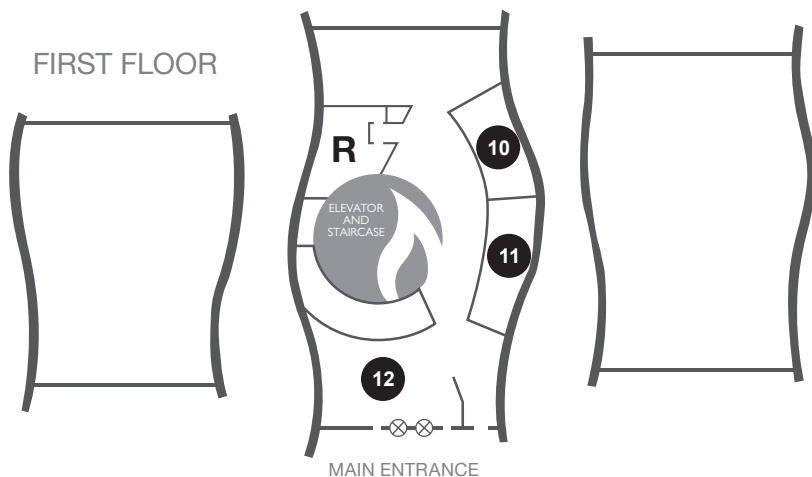

Truth & Healing Artist Showcase

Open now through September 10

Explore themes of healing, rebirth and reconnection and the struggles that people of color experience within the Cincinnati region, including the mental challenges that come with cultural and racial divisions and the ongoing inequities Black and Brown people face. Despite these challenges, glimmers of hope shine brightly, allowing us to heal by reminding us what Black love looks like and the quest for joy during difficult times.

Funding and curation for this exhibition comes through ArtsWave's Black and Brown Artist Program, the largest commissioning art program for local artists of color. ArtsWave – the region's engine for the arts – created this program to provide financial support and to interpret the themes of our times. The Black and Brown Artist Program is supported by the City of Cincinnati, Macy's, Duke Energy, Fifth Third Bank, Greater Cincinnati Foundation and Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center.
